

Math Editor Troubleshooting: How to Enable Java in a Web Browser

Math editor is powered by JAVA that means you need to have JAVA plugin installed on your browser before using it. If you are facing any kind of issue in enabling the JAVA plugin for your web browser, please follow the instructions below on the three popular browsers:

Internet Explorer

1. Click **Tools** and then **Internet Options**
2. Select the **Security** tab, and select the **Custom Level** button
3. Scroll down to **Scripting of Java applets**
4. Make sure the **Enable** radio button is checked
5. Click **OK** to save your preference

Firefox

1. Start Mozilla Firefox browser or restart it if it is already running
2. At the top of the browser, select the **Firefox** button (or **Tools** menu in Windows XP), then **Add-ons**.
3. The Add-ons Manager tab will open.
4. In the Add-ons Manager tab, select **Plugins**
5. Click **Java (TM) Platform** plugin to select it
6. Click on the **Enable** button (if the button says **Disable**, Java is already enabled)

Chrome

1. Open Chrome **Settings**.
2. Click to open the **Advanced** Section.
3. Click to open **Content settings** under the **Privacy and security** tab.
4. Locate **JavaScript**.
5. Enable JavaScript toggle button to **Allowed**.
